Self, politics and theology: beyond ego-centric reason

DESCRIPTION

The subject of the proposed reflection is the concept of human self from the perspective of Christian theology. The lecture is an invitation for a theological, critical dialogue with modernity which focus its own interest in human subjectivity. Although theology reflected on the issue of subjectivity almost from its beginning, it has not developed a fully achieved and systematic vision of human self. The elaboration of the specifically theological vision of human subjectivity is, therefore, not only an important task for the sake of reflection of faith, but also has great importance for the creation and presentation of the Christian vision of reality, including politics.
